
Review Week 3

Do Faith and Reason Mix?

If I asked you to "just believe" what's your response?

- We don't just believe. (blind faith)
- We believe in something (object of our faith.)
- You can't <u>separate</u> believing from <u>reasoning</u>.
- We need <u>reason</u> in order to have <u>faith</u>.
- Faith means <u>living</u> like our beliefs are <u>true</u>. <u>(video)</u>
- Lets look up Hebrews 11:1



"The Triumphs of Faith (NASB)"

11 Now faith is the assurance of *things* hoped for, the conviction of things not seen.

The Relationship of Faith and Reason:

- Reason comes <u>before faith</u> in that you need to understand what you're putting your faith in.
- We've got to use our <u>minds (which reasons)</u> to even be able to read the words in our Bibles, understand the gospel, and believe it's true.
- "Strong faith is NOT believing things you suspect aren't true, if that's the case then the strongest faith you could have is knowing something isn't true and still be able to believe it, which is an amazing feat" (Is Faith Really Blind? - Part One - Michael Ramsden – YouTube)

Who is Christ?

"Let us give thanks to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! Because of his great mercy he gave us new life **by raising Jesus Christ from death**. This fills us with a living **hope**,..." *I Peter 1:3*

"And so I will always <u>remind</u> you of these matters, even though you already know them and are firmly grounded in the truth you have <u>received</u>. ¹³ I think it only right for me to <u>stir</u> up your memory of these matters as long as I <u>am</u> still alive." <u>2 Peter 1:12,13</u>

"We have not <u>depended</u> on made-up stories in <u>making</u> known to you the mighty coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. With our own eyes we <u>saw</u> his greatness. ¹⁷ We <u>were there</u> when he was <u>given</u> honor and glory by God the Father, when the voice <u>came</u> to him from the Supreme Glory, saying, "This <u>is</u> my own dear Son, with whom I <u>am</u> pleased!" ¹⁸ We ourselves <u>heard</u> this voice <u>coming</u> from heaven, when we <u>were</u> with him on the holy mountain."

1 Corinthians 15:4-8 Amplified Bible (AMP)

• ⁴ and that He <u>was buried</u>, and that He <u>was</u> [bodily] <u>raised</u> on the third day according to [that which] the Scriptures [foretold], ⁵ and that He <u>appeared</u> to Cephas (Peter), then to the ^[a]Twelve. ⁶ After that He <u>appeared</u> to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, the majority of whom are still alive, but some have fallen asleep [in death].

- ⁷Then He was <u>seen</u> by James, then by all the apostles, ⁸ and last of all, as to one ^[b]untimely (prematurely, traumatically) born, He <u>appeared</u> to me also.
- <u>1 Corinthians 15:5</u> A title referring to the original disciples chosen by Jesus (including Judas). A few hours after betraying Jesus, Judas committed suicide (Matt 27:5) leaving only the eleven (Matt 28:16; Mark 16:14; Luke 24:9, 33).
- <u>1 Corinthians 15:8</u> Paul's life-changing encounter with the resurrected Christ occurred on the road to Damascus (Acts 9).

Knowing the Faith is True (pressure's off)

- It's ultimately the Holy Spirit that <u>assures</u> <u>believers</u>
 Christianity is true.
- It's ultimately the Holy Spirit that <u>convinces</u> <u>unbelievers</u> Christianity is true.



Showing the Faith is True

- One of our roles is to <u>share arguments</u> and evidences for Christian truth claims.
- The Holy Spirit's role is to work in the unbeliever's heart in such a way that he or she is persuaded that Christianity is true.
- So why does the author of Hebrews provide evidences of the past faith? i.e. "the hall of faith"
